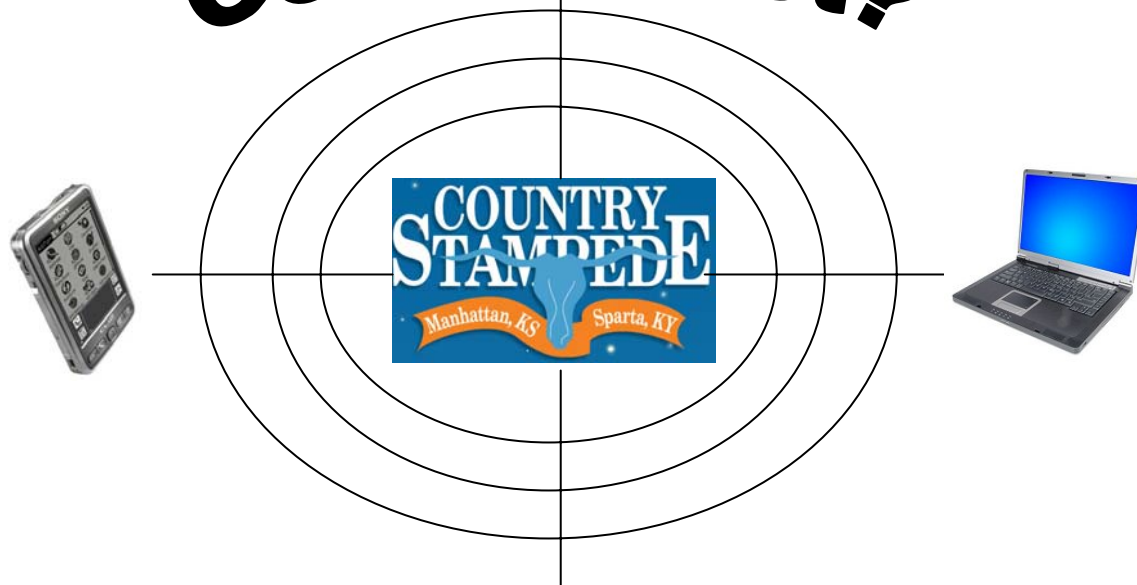


# KansasNet's STAMPEDE HOTSPOT

## Got Internet?



### What is a "HotSpot?"

HotSpot is a public location that has a readily accessible wireless network for laptop computers, PDA's or any other devices that are wirelessly-enabled (the standard used is 802.11b). Users who have wireless-ready devices, can connect to the network for a small fee, and use that connection to connect to the Internet.

### What equipment do I need to connect to the HotSpot?

Most new mobile computing devices (laptops, PDA's, tablets, etc.) come with 802.11b wireless interfaces already built-in. You can also upgrade newer mobile devices that don't have wireless capabilities built-in by purchasing and installing an after-market expansion card. (Fox Business Systems (785) 776-1452 is a local business that carries such expansion cards).

### What can I do while connected to a HotSpot?

While connected to a HotSpot, you can do anything you would normally do on the Internet, including download your email (including attachments), visit web pages, check stock prices, watch or bid on online auctions, watch a live webcast, listen to streaming audio, and much, much more.

### I have my wireless-ready device, what do I do to get connected?

If you are using Windows XP, you should be able to try to connect to any website, and the HotSpot will take over & lead you from there. If you are using an older operating system (Windows 9x, 2000/ME, or any non-Microsoft OS's), you will need to specify the Service Set Identifier (SSID). This ID will tell your computer what it needs to connect to the HotSpot.

The Country Stampede SSID is: stampede (All lower case).

### What if I don't know how to enter the SSID, or have other trouble getting connected to the HotSpot?

You will want to contact the manufacturer of your device or wireless expansion card for assistance entering settings, or for trouble-shooting.
